NOTIFICATION OF THE OFFICE OF THE COUNCIL OF STATE

RE: INTENT ON THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE OFFICE OF THE COUNCIL OF STATE
IN GOOD FAITH

The Office of the Council of State has recognised the problems and impact of corruption that has led to adverse effects on the country and the people, and has prioritized the prevention and suppression of corruption in all forms. The executive of the Office of the Council of State hereby declares that he will administer work with honesty and faithfulness in accordance with the principles of good governance, to build trust in society, by carrying out the following:

1. Transparency: rendering, disclosing and giving access to information of the organisation, by giving the ability to access complete, accurate and current information without withholding or distorting information, for transparency and openness;

2. Accountability: having intent in administration in good faith, and being accountable for the performance and administration of work;

3. Freedom from corruption in the performance of work: performing every stage of work in accordance with laws, rules and regulations, not accepting bribery, not using a position of work to gain advantage, and acting without corruption in policy, including supporting the performance of work by personnel to be strictly in accordance with laws, rules and regulations;

4. Virtue-based organizational work culture: creating and fostering a honesty-based work culture within the organisation to prevent and suppress corruption, to prevent conflict of interest, to shame and fear corruption, and to not tolerate corruption;

5. Virtue in the performance of work within the organisation: having a clear standard for the performance of work that is fair, non-discriminatory and has virtue in the administration of personnel, virtue in the delegation of work, the management of work environment and the budget.
